Wimberley History, Trivia, Fun Facts

From the book Wimberley It's Deep in the Heart of Texas by Bill and M.F. Johnson.

Wimberley- A Village Growth TimeLine from 1847-2000

On April 5, 1847, Texas Governor Pinkney Henderson granted 1280 acres of land to William R. Baker that later became our little town. By the 1850s, Wimberley had a general store, grist mill, tannery, shoe shop and a school. 20 years later, a blacksmith shop became part of the square. In 1869, a huge flood hit Wimberley with water covering the square. In 1880, a post office was added for the 140 people living in the village, and there were 9 houses around the square. In 1921, the road to San Marcos was completed but not paved. 1929 saw the biggest flood since 1869. In 1934, the Wimberley Mill was razed after being shut down for 5 years. 1939 was the year electricity came to Wimberley. Wimberley's population according to the 1940 census was about 400 (around 175 families). In 1941 the muddy and badly rutted square was covered in gravel hauled from a creek near Jacob's Well. In 1947, there was great excitement in town when the road to San Marcos was paved, and in 1948, the square was finally paved. The Senior Citizen Association began in 1948 to raise funds to build a place for citizens to meet. 1950-57 saw 7 years of drought. In 1957 there was a 31 foot flood on the Blanco. In 1958, the bridge over the Blanco River on RR12 was built. In 1965, Wimberley experienced a bad day when the Scudder's Wimberley Ranch House (restaurant, store, hotel and feed store) burned to the ground. After the fire, the Wimberley Restoration Association was formed

to buy the land around the square to help guide future development. In 1997, the Wimberley Senior Citizens purchased the Winters House and 5 acres with the goal of establishing a town cultural center and museum. In 1998, there was a large flood on the creek. In 2000, the Village of Wimberley was incorporated.

January To Do List

Plant: ornamental & wildlife

- Annual transplants: pansies, violas, calendula (wildlife plant), snapdragon, stock, larkspur, ornamental kale & cabbage, bluebonnet transplants, poppies. Transplants are preferred over seeds at this point.
- Evergreen perennials
- Trees, shrubs, roses
- Evergreen groundcovers like monkey grass, liriope, creeping germander, frogfruit

Plant: herbs

- Calendula, chervil, cilantro, chives, dill, parsley, feverfew, oregano, sorrel, thyme, garlic chives
- · Protect cilantro and chives in below freezing weather

Plant: food crops

- Artichokes, asparagus, onions, greens, lettuce, spinach, radish, carrots, beets, bok choy, collards, kale, peas, turnips, leeks, broccoli
- Prep potatoes to plant in February. Get now to cut and dry for a few weeks
- Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Vegetable Planting Guides (Central Texas)

Plant: fruit

Apples, peaches, pecans, pears, pomegranates, persimmons, figs, almonds, grapes, strawberries,
 raspberries, blackberries

Prune

- Okay to prune freeze-damaged perennials. If possible, leave as long as possible for wildlife shelter and food on seed-bearers
- Prune grapes, fruit trees, blackberries
- Cut asters and chrysanthemums to rosettes
- Late month: prune woody salvias as much as ²/₃ to encourage new growth
- Trees, including red oaks and live oaks

- Prune rosemary and oregano
- Avoid pruning other evergreen shrubs

Divide/Move

Dormant perennials, roses, shrubs and trees. This is the best time to move plants!

Prep

- Add compost to vegetable gardens along with organic fertilizer in prep for another round of winter vegetables
- Soil test

Lawn

- If must mow, keep high to shade out germinating weeds
- It's really not a good idea to overseed with rye unless you have new, muddy construction and a dog!

Other tasks

- Spray trees
- Keep floating row cover available; avoid covering plants with plastic
- Spray fruit trees with dormant oil to control overwintering scale, plum curculio and other pests.
