The Greater Roadrunner is a fascinating animal:

- Prehistoric- dates from 33,500 years ago
- Lives throughout Texas but is very rare in the forested eastern Texas
- Breed up to 3x a year from early March to late October. November through February they live alone.
- Nest in thorny shrubs and clumps of cacti
- Can out race a human
- Can kill a rattlesnake by pinning its head and bashing it against a rock- partially swallows the rattlesnake and eats it a little at a time.
- Natural enemy is a coyote. A coyote can runs about 43 mph; a roadrunner runs 20+ mph
- Eat venomous prey such as lizards and scorpions
- Oldest known age is 7 years- discovered by banding
- X shaped footprint disguises the direction it is headed

• Swallows horned lizards headfirst with the belly pointing up to avoid being harmed by the horns.
